





If you need a gluten-free wafer, simply ask a pastor or the person distributing Communion. The gluten-free wafers are now stored in a separate compartment of the intinctorium (the vessel holding the Communion wafers).

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.


