Why do we light the PINK candle during Advent?

According to tradition, the Third Sunday in Advent is *Gaudete* Sunday—the day when a pink candle is lit on the Advent Wreath. *Gaudete* means"joy" in Latin, and this day is traditionally celebrated on the Third Sunday of Advent. It is called the "joy" candle because of Mary's joyful announcement of Christ's coming birth. So the pink flair in the Advent Wreath is the candle of "joy"—a break in the darkness of waiting.
