

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 5:16–21 (Please turn to page 191 in the New Testament of your pew Bible).





We'll bring it to you. If you do not wish to partake of the Sacrament, simply remain seated when your row is directed to come forward. Gluten-free wafers are available; simply ask the server.




