The assembly stands. All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

Here, we are grafted into the tree of life, with leaves for the healing of the world. Pour out your Holy Spirit on this assembly, into this community, and throughout all creation. Grant that all may drink of your mercy and peace, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.



THE NICENE CREED


Blessed are you, O God, ruler of heaven and earth.




PREFACE

If you are not able to take the wine, simply take the bread. Children are invited to come forward for a blessing. If you desire Communion, but are not able to come forward, please let an usher know. We'll bring it to you. If you do not wish to partake of the Sacrament, simply remain seated when your row is directed to come forward. Gluten-free wafers are available; simply ask the server.

The table of life is spread before you. Feast on the goodness and mercy of God.


