Silence is kept for reflection. The assembly may stand or kneel.



PRAYER OF THE DAY


Let us pray.





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THE APOSTLES' CREED


I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.



God invites you to this table of bounty. Come, the banquet is ready.



When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers say The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you. and each person may respond, Amen.


Jesus Christ is the host of this Holy Communion. in which we celebrate the Real Presence of our Lord. All are welcome! The Communion is administered by "intinction," that is, the bread is handed to the communicant and the communicant dips the bread into the wine. If you are not able to take the wine, simply take the bread. Children are invited to come forward for a blessing. If you desire Communion, but are not able to come forward, please let an usher know. We'll bring it to you. If you do not wish to partake of the Sacrament, simply remain seated when your row is directed to come forward. Gluten-free wafers are available; simply ask the server.

Survey Says...

Mary and Martha Ballot Results

Last Sunday we tried something new. We took a ballot concerning two hymns that interpreted Luke's story about Mary and Martha. We sang both hymns after the sermon. The hymns were: "When Jesus was in Bethany" and "Martha Labored in the Kitchen." People were to choose "the best hymn," and some wrote a short commentary explaining their choice. Here are the results.

First Service (9 AM)

Favorite Hymn: "Martha Labored in the Kitchen" Vote: 47 to 12. [No difference in voting between men and women]

Second Service (11 AM)

Favorite Hymn: "When Jesus was in Bethany" Vote: 16 to 10 [No difference in voting between men and women]

Concerning voting, there was no difference between women and men. However, 33 women wrote comments compared to 15 men. Let me include a sampling of the comments included on ballot sheet.

- "When younger, I would have voted to be Martha; now I'm for Mary."

- "I'm a Martha, and I'm not happy about it."

- "I chose "When Jesus was in Bethany" because of the line: "We have to find a balance in God."

- "In reference to the hymn, "Martha Labored in the Kitchen,"- it sounds like me!"

- "I suggest both hymns were written by men. Try managing a big event alone."

- "I like both! They tell us a story that relates to our lives today."
- "Start on a positive note versus someone complaining."

-"God was in both women carrying out their callings to what was needed at that time ..."

- "Mary and Martha are not a dilemma (opposite truths) but a paradox (parallel truths) which needs metanoia to solve.

- "I think both are wise."

- "When Jesus speaks, listen."

- "I'm married to a Martha."
- "If I follow Jesus, all will get done."
- "Try to live a balanced life."

- "Martha should not have complained about her sister. But someone had to do the work. She probably could not afford a caterer. Moderation is important."
