CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

The assembly stands. All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins. Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, the eternal voice from heaven, the anointed and beloved one, the Spirit moving over the waters. **Amen.** As we approach the mystery of God, let us come in confession, trusting the love of Christ crucified and risen.

Silence is kept for reflection. The assembly may stand or kneel.

God who searches us and knows us, you have shown us what is good, but we have looked to other lights to find our way. We have not been just in our dealings with others. We have chosen revenge over mercy. We have promoted ourselves instead of walking humbly with you. With what shall we come before you? Forgive us our sin, and show us your salvation in the face of Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

Beloved of God, you have not received the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, poured out for you in the faithfulness of Jesus Christ. Receive the promise of baptism: You are God's child; + your sins are forgiven. Rejoice and be glad, for yours is the reign of heaven. **Amen.**

FIRST READING: Isaiah 9:1–4 (Please turn to your pew Bible, Old Testament, Page 706).

The northern tribes of Zebulun and Naphtali experienced defeat, but they are assured that their condition will be reversed when God makes a light-filled appearance. The joy they will experience will resemble celebrations of great harvests, because God will deliver them from everything that diminishes or oppresses them. The people in the northern parts of Israel have experienced "gloom" and "darkness" because of the destruction wrought by Assyrian military forces. To these people, the prophet announces the shining of a great light of salvation.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:10–18 (Please turn to your pew Bible, New Testament, Page 173).

Paul calls on the Corinthians to end their dissensions and share the unified outlook of the gospel. Discord arises when we forget that we belong not to human leaders or institutions but to Christ who was crucified for us. Indeed, the unifying word of the cross of Christ is the center of the gospel and the power of God's salvation.

We'll bring it to you. If you do not wish to partake of the Sacrament, simply remain seated when your row is directed to come forward. Gluten-free wafers are available; simply ask the server.

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen

However, locally we have been able to provide quilts for baptisms, St. Matthew's House, Habitat families and Senior students from Immokalee going on to higher education.

New batting is our largest expense which is greater than \$5 per quilt. Other costs include thread, crochet cord and fabric as needed. Shipping to LWR costs \$2.25 per quilt. Fabric donations are appreciated—especially cotton fabric and lighter weight drapery fabric. If you would like to make a monetary contribution, donation

envelopes are attached to each quilt.

The Emmanuel Quilters meet every Monday from November through April. We meet in the Community Room from 9:30 to 1:30. We design, sew and tie the quilts. Some quilt tops are sewn at home.
