The what & the why?

Dinner for 6 or 8 is an opportunity to gather with a small group of adults from Emmanuel and share a meal while getting to know one another. Our goal, is that this same group would meet for dinner one time in January, one time in February, one time in March and one time in April.

Normally, we can only meet in fellowship on Sundays. Dinner for 6 or 8 is a program offering a break to this cycle by intentionally placing members together, who may not know each other well, in fellowship over a meal, centered on a brief prayer, scripture, and blessing. Getting to know our sisters and brothers in Christ at Emmanuel is essential for us in our growth in faith together. Dinner for 6 or 8 seeks to live out the congregational model of Acts 2, where "day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved." Won't you please spend some time in prayer, and consider joining us for Dinner for 6 or 8.

What's involved?

Dinner for 6 or 8 will officially begin in January 2019. So the only thing to do during the months of November and December is to pray and sign up. If you're up north until January, no problem, just sign up by calling the church or sending an email. On Thursday, January 3, everyone who signed up will receive an email telling them who is in their group (either 6 or 8). In the email, you will be given the simple instructions to organize a group email and make a few simple decisions as a group. Decision #1: What date will the group have its first dinner together in January? Decision #2: Who from the group will host the dinner in January? Decision #3: What's for dinner? Decision #4: What should each person\couple bring for the first dinner? Decision #5: Who will be the "group facilitator" for the first dinner?

Pray for the people who have been impacted by this event . May God's healing presence give them peace and hope in their time of need.



Parish Nurse - Stephen Ministry



Carol Calling: What a beautiful time of the year when we anticipate the celebration of the birth of Baby Jesus. I love this season. I hope it is a good month for you and a joyous holiday season.

Consider these bits and pieces from me as we wrap up the newsletters for 2018:

We are into the heart of the flu season, and I have read articles about tossing away your toothbrush after you have had a bout of sickness. The American Dental Association states that though our mouths are always full of a wide variety of germs, there is no research showing that these bugs transferred to your brush will actually make you sick. The chances of reinfection after an illness are extremely low. But, you should always rinse your brush in warm water and let it air day

after each use. Never share your toothbrush, and replace the brush (including the powered brush heads) every three to four months.

According to the European Respiratory Journal, July 11, 2018, smart diet choices may help lower the symptoms of asthma. People who eat plenty of produce, whole grains, nuts, beans, fish and olive oil and kept the consumption of meat, salt and sugar to a minimum had lower odds of experiencing asthma symptoms. Does this sound familiar to you? Researchers say that healthy eating may promote a proper balance of "good" bacteria in the intestines which may curb airway inflammation. Interesting research to consider. A healthy diet was also associated with lower odds of poorly controlled asthma. The research considered how often rescue medication was needed and how much the asthma interfered with daily life.

And while we are on the subject of food, let's talk about the many benefits of eating beans. Beans really might be the most deserving of being called superfoods. In addition to being inexpensive, they are full of nutrients including copper, folate, iron, magnesium, potassium and zinc with the added benefit of being a high fiber food full of protein. Beans are actually vegetable and protein. Try a variety of them as each of the beans contains different nutrients. Read your labels and check it out when you go shopping. And remember that while dried beans require soaking before cooking, canned beans are convenient and supply the same nutrients. They do contain added salt, so be aware of that if you are on a low sodium diet.

And one more fun fact.....a review of numerous studies shows that people low in vitamin D had a 31 percent higher risk of colon cancer compared with those at recommended levels. And, supplements have not proved to help according to the Journal of National Cancer Institute, June 2018. Dietary Guidelines suggest focusing on food sources such as fortified dairy, salmon, tuna and eggs to name a few. And because our skin makes vitamin D when exposed to sunshine, try getting even 5 minutes twice a week in the sun to help promote this.

Blessings on you this Christmas month as we celebrate Advent and all the beautiful holiday events planned for this December. See you back here in January 2019.

- ...after the relationship falls apart and the bottom falls out of you life.
- ...after the doctor says, "I'm sorry, but there's nothing more we can do."
- ...after the nursing home director shakes your hand and says, "Welcome to your new home."
- ...after the last child honks the horn, waves, and dries away and the house suddenly seems empty.
- ...after the gavel comes down, the handcuffs go on, and your loved one is led away.
- ...after the baby arrives, demanding more of you that you ever dreamed possible.
- ...after you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.
- ...after your family and friends have heard your story aone too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are the After People. They are ready to come alongside you - or your friends, neighbors, coworkers, or relatives - and provide comfort and support for as long *after* as needed.





This September when I was on Sabbatical, Doug and I took a trip out west and one of our stops was the Grand Canyon, North Rim. We had reservations at the lodge there, which was not only convenient to hiking, but also I had an experience that will always be with me.

Being the coffee fiend that I am, I was glad to see that our room had a coffee maker and of course, coffee. But, "Oh no,what am I going to do?" I said to Doug: They have only 2 packages of regular and 2 of decaf. (What's the point of decaf?). Doug said he gladly would drink the Decaf---but of course, that was not acceptable to me...

So I went outside and saw the service worker (who I used to call the "maid"). I walked towards her, waving my two packets of decaf, said Hello, and asked if she would SWAP my two decafs with the more "REAL" coffee.

This tall, thin, young lady had a huge smile on her face, a sparkle in her eye, and she treated me as if I were the ONLY person in the world. She said, "Of course you can have two more—do you want any more than that? You can have as many as you want!" smiling all the time. I was blown away by all of this, and I just said No, that's fine, this is perfect. Thank you!

Then she proceeded to ask me where we were from, and where we were going on our first day. I told her the name of the trail we were taking, and she told me to have a beautiful day. WOW. I went back with my coffee, and told Doug about her.

Later that afternoon, when we returned, we were sitting outside with our iced tea, when she asked Doug and me about our day. Again, she treated us like we were the **only two people** in the world – and being it was Labor Day weekend, the place was nacked

I then asked her name—Eugenia—originally from a small town around Las Vegas—she was about 25, an African American, and married to another worker there, who by the way, was Lebanese, and had recently attained full citizenship. They stayed in housing with all the other service workers, so they were part of a community that works in our National Park system.

Our brief conversations went on for the 3 days we were there. I said to Eugenia on the last day, "I don't usually say this, but I have to tell you that you do your job with such passion and with such joy. Thank you for making us (and everyone you meet)

We hugged each other, and we both said "God Bless You" at the same time.

Needless to say, Eugenia received glowing comments when we filled out our survey at the end of our stay. (And we left a larger than usual tip, which was a no-brainer).

No, I didn't get an email or any type of an address, but Eugenia and her husband will remain in my heart and in my prayers. I am convinced that Eugenia did not consider hers a boring, mundane job---she brightened up the days of every person she met.

Although I doubt she considered herself a "living sacrifice," I certainly did—with the love she gave away so freely to others. When I think of the beauty of the Grand Canyon, Eugenia will always come to my mind.

PRAYER: Dear Heavenly Father,

feel so welcome.

Thank you for giving us the opportunity to reach out to one another and to work together as the Body of Christ. Help each and every one of us to know how we can become a living sacrifice and how we can discern your good, acceptable, and perfect will in our lives.
