


PREFACE

Invitation to Communion


We who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread. Come. Be filled with light and life.

COMMUNION

When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers say The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you. and each person may respond Amen.

COMMUNION SONG

Invited to the Lord's Table are all baptized Christians who celebrate with us the Real Presence of Christ in the Sacrament. The Communion is administered by "intinction," that is, the bread is handed to the communicant and the communicant dips the bread into the wine. If you are not able to take the wine, simply take the bread. Children are invited to come forward for a blessing. If you desire Communion, but are not able to come forward. please let an usher know. We'll bring it to you. If you do not wish to partake of the Sacrament, simply remain seated when your row is directed to come forward. **GLUTEN-FREE WAFERS** AVAILABLE. If you need a gluten-free wafer, simply ask a pastor or the person distributing Communion.
