
Wednesday, February 7 from 5:00 - 7:30 pm

Parish Nurse - Stephen Ministry



Carol Calling:

If you are trying your best to avoid the cold and flu bug this season, here is some more food for thought which I hope will help you. First and foremost, get a yearly flu vaccine. The medical doctors say it is still not too late. And get the pneumonia vaccine according to your physician's protocol. Lather up often during the day...especially after shaking hands or touching door knobs and door handles out in the public places. If there is no soap, use alcohol-based sanitizer as a substitute. Keep your hands away from your mouth and nose. Get lots of rest and drink plenty of fluids.

A sore throat and runny nose followed by about 10 days of coughing and sneezing could be the common cold- basically a viral infection that spreads through the air, by touching surfaces where the virus lives or even by shaking hands and then touching your mouth and nose. Rest and fluids are essential and some over the counter medicines may help soothe the symptoms. Ask for help from your pharmacist.

A cough accompanied by a sudden high fever, chills, body aches, sore throat and fatigue could be the flu. Todd Astor, a pulmonologist at Mass General in Boston, says "the influenza tends to come on like a truck". With symptoms such as this, you should get to your doctor as soon as possible. There are medications which can shorten the duration and effect of the flu if you take them early enough in the course of the problem.

A cough, soreness in the chest and a fever could be bronchitis. This is inflammation of the bronchial tubes-the airways swell and produce mucus which causes the cough. See your doctor who may take an X-ray to rule out pneumonia and determine what medications will give you relief. Drink plenty of fluids and you might even take a hot shower to breathe in steam for relief. This can be very comforting.

If pneumonia (an infection in one or both lungs) is diagnosed, then it will most likely be necessary for your physician to prescribe an antibiotic. Do not try to treat these winter "cold/flu" symptoms by yourself. Get the advice of your primary care physician or your trusted pharmacist.

And please, if you think you might be carrying one of these viruses or feel you are "coming down" with one of them stay home, rest, drink lots of fluids and take care of yourself rather than coming to work or exposing others in a public place. Everyone will thank you for being considerate, and your body will thank you for giving it a chance to recover.

In 2006, the early vision for the Alive service was forged by staff members, Pastor Deborah Fergus and Deacon Jim Cooper, along with David Hopley, who was a passionate congregational member determined to make the Alive service a reality. *Thank you, David!* (He has since passed on to be with the Lord.)

In the spring of 2012, Pastor Fergus retired and Jim Cooper assumed the primary responsibility of managing the service. Over the years there have been five terrific Alive-Band leaders. First there was Brandon Kidder, then there was John O'Connor, followed by Todd Partin and then for several great years, Ken Hodsdon. In August 2017, Ken retired and now we are blessed to have the musical gifts and talents of Colin Hart.

Finally as mentioned earlier, we give all our thanks to God for all the good that has come through the Alive Service over these past 10 years. *Thank you, Lord!*

Along with this prayer of thanksgiving, we also ask that God would continue to greatly bless this service in the days and years to come, and that God would draw in hundreds of new people from around our community, who are longing for the love of God and seeking a caring Christian community.

Thousands of Lutheran teens from across the U.S. will gather in Houston for the 2018 ELCA Youth Gathering. We have about 12 youth from our Mooring Line and Pebblebrooke campuses attending this year. The five-day event is an opportunity for teens to connect with each other, give back to the community and be inspired in their faith.

The event theme, "This Changes Everything," was developed during a retreat where they studied evaluations from the 2015 event which revealed a common concern among youth, "I need to know that I'm enough." Event director, Molly Beck Dean, said the group realized that if teens could truly believe that God's grace is freely given, that Jesus died for their sins if they could really wrap their heads around that and believe in it - that would change everything.

Houston was chosen as this year's host city because it "has a lot to teach us: it's the most multicultural city in the nation."

Cody Miller is coordinating a host of service - learning opportunities for Gathering attendees, including working with refugee resettlement and human trafficking prevention agencies, food banks and community gardens. In addition, art installation projects, neighborhood cleanups will be completed, and attendees are asked to bring a book from Blast off for Books drive to increase community literacy.

Other faith formation activities held throughout the Gathering include Bible study, worship, interactive learning, live entertainment and speakers such as Nadia Bolz-Weber, an author and ELCA pastor.

Michael Rinehart, bishop of the Texas-Louisiana Gulf Coast Synod, said youth at this year's event can expect to be challenged in their faith, to grow in their faith and may even discover their calling.

Ally McDonough, a high school representative from S.C., advises youth who are attending to "be open to new opportunities, whether it be walking up to a stranger and striking up a conversation, or opening up your heart and soul to the call of the Spirit. It's amazing what happens when you sit and listen for a while."


