EMMANUEL LUTHERAN TO BE VISITED BY ELCA'S PRESIDING BISHOP!

(Preaching 9:00 & 11:00 on Jan. 21st)

The Presiding Bishop of the ELCA, The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton, will be preaching at Emmanuel on Sunday, January 21st at both our 9:00 and 11:00 am services. Elected as the ELCA's fourth presiding bishop at the 2013 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the Rev. Elizabeth Eaton earned a Master of Divinity degree from Harvard Divinity School and a Bachelor of Music Education from the College of Wooster.

Ordained in 1981, Eaton served three congregations in Ohio before being elected bishop of the ELCA Northeastern Ohio Synod in 2006 and re-elected in May 2013.

Eaton's four emphases for the ELCA are: We are church. We are Lutheran. We are church together. We are church for the sake of the world. These four emphases are fundamental to identifying who the ELCA is.

Through partnerships with local community institutions, Partners Worldwide provides mentoring, training, access to capital, and advocacy tools to entrepreneurs in over 30 countries around the world. Seebeck is also a founding member of PW Entrepreneurs, a social-venture capital fund investing in high-impact global enterprises.

In his co-authored work *My Business, My Mission*, Seebeck shares stories and lessons learned from inspirational business leaders around the world. He holds a B.S. in Agronomy from Washington State University and an M.A. in Leadership Studies from Azusa Pacific University.

Doug lives in Grand Rapids, Michigan with his beloved wife of 35 years, Gail. They have five children and three grandchildren.

Jack VanDer Ploeg, a retired business man who volunteers to work with small businesses to help them grow and provide employment for the unemployed, is currently working with volunteers in 10 cities in Haiti with a goal of adding 100,000 jobs by 2020.

Grace Place Puts Faith Into Action



Providing Pathways Out of Poverty By Educating Children and Families

When Jorge first walked onto the Grace Place campus, he had no idea that those steps would change the lives of his entire family.

Jorge needed to learn English, and was looking for help preparing for his citizenship exam. He was worried sick, since he had only three years of formal schooling in Guatemala, his birth country. As Jorge spent time on our campus, he realized his entire family could benefit from Grace Place's comprehensive family literacy programing.

Jorge's wife, Mariana, and their two preschool-aged children enrolled in our Bright Beginnings program soon after. When Mariana began, she was anxious and exhausted caring for her children. Through Bright Beginnings, Mariana gained confidence as a mother and learned to be her children's first teacher. Now, Mariana is thriving and so are her kids. They will enter kindergarten next year, completely prepared.

Jorge not only passed his citizenship exam, he earned a promotion at work thanks, in part, to his growing command of the English language. Jorge credits his Grace Place English and citizenship teachers for his success. We credit Jorge for his hard work.

Mariana and Jorge have built a platform from which their two children can launch their lives. As their family strives, our School Age programs will help ensure that their children become the first in their family to graduate high school and enter college. It may seem an impossible task, but it is very likely that they will succeed with the foundation they have laid at Grace Place.



Carol Calling:

Welcome 2018......

A question for you for the New Year? Which is better for getting hands clean and germ-free: soap and water or hand sanitizer? The answer= soap and water! Wet your hands, lather up and rub your hands for 20 seconds, then rinse thoroughly and dry. This is the best method to reduce bacteria, viruses and parasites. However, FYI, a sanitizer that is at least 60 percent alcohol is better than nothing if you cover your hands

thoroughly, rub it in, and do not wipe it off.

Consumer Union, the policy and mobilization division of Consumer Reports sends us this message: "Consumers are key actors in the fight against antibiotic resistance, and personal choices are critical to whether the problem grows or diminishes". Here are their suggestions. Don't push your doctor to prescribe antibiotics- they are not helpful against viral infections. If you do need one, request a drug that is targeted to the bacteria causing your infection, rather than a broad-spectrum antibiotic. For more information on this subject, go to CR.org/superbugs.

Australia's Black Dog Institute found in a large study, that those who did NO exercise were 44 percent more likely to develop depression than those who were active for just 60 minutes a week. Low-intensity moves such as walking were just as effective as moderate and high-intensity moves.

From Consumer Reports "On Health" January 2018....There are healthy convenience foods that can make eating well easy for us. Take advantage of canned or boxed tomatoes. They contain lycopene, an antioxidant found to reduce the risk of heart disease and some cancers. Canned or pouched salmon is mostly wild-caught. Fisheries harvest during a particular season and the excess they harvest is funneled into frozen or shelf stable packages. Canned salmon costs less and is lower in calories and saturated fat than the farmed form. Precooked, peeled hard-boiled eggs supply protein and they are low in saturated fat. They also contain compounds that have antioxidant and anti-inflammatory properties. As for the cholesterol in eggs, research has found that it is not likely to have a significant effect on blood cholesterol in healthy people. Beans are always a healthy option. They are a top food source of resistant starch, a prebiotic fiber that bacteria in the gut use to produce compounds which may help prevent colon cancer. Plus, the combination of protein, fiber and vitamins makes legumes nutrient-dense and filling. Be aware the sodium content can vary, so check the labels for the lower sodium choices.
