My dear siblings in faith,

The book of Galatians is a powerful letter. I am always so moved by Apostle Paul's words, but I recognize sometimes that we may get lost in some of the imagery. Paul often speaks about the "flesh" in conflict with the Spirit. It is easy to start to think that the body isn't important or that it is somehow wrong or sinful but that isn't Paul's intention. The



way Apostle Paul speaks about the flesh should not be confused with an actual body. As a general rule, he distinguishes between body $(\sigma \tilde{\omega} \mu \alpha)$ and flesh (σάρξ). The "flesh" in Paul's thought is a willing tool of sin. He uses the word "flesh" to represent human weakness, but the body is a complete person that is created by God, belongs to God, and conveys the glory of God (1 Cor 6:19-20).

Our bodies are good and valuable. We are all beautifully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139:14). In the last few years, I have started to observe that often Christians forget the importance of our bodies. We forget that not only our spirit but our unique bodies are made in the image of God. I sometimes forget myself. I get lost in societies' messages of what beauty is and messages of how we should present ourselves. This is why every morning, when I wash my face, I take time to remind myself of my baptism. I remind myself as the water touches my skin that I am a claimed beautiful child of God in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I pray as you read this that the Spirit gives you ears to hear that you are a beautiful beloved child of God. May the Spirit lead you to love yourself and your neighbor as a whole person (body and spirit).
