



Introducing Resident Pastor Karole Langset

Greetings Emmanuel Lutheran Church,

Grace to you and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. My name is Karole Langset, and I will be with you the next two years as your resident pastor. I cannot truly express how grateful I am for you. I give thanks to God for you for it is truly evident that the Spirit is among you. I have spent a lot of time in prayer waiting in eager anticipation to be with you all. Before I even knew the name of the congregation, I was praying for you. I will continue to lift up prayers of thanksgiving, for you truly reflect the grace of God through Jesus the Christ.





I was raised by people of Christian faith in the ELCA. Growing up in the church, I always felt the church was my adopted family. Witnessing the Spirit work through church congregations and their active faith has nurtured my faith and sense of call. I am inspired by music ministers, Sunday school teachers, clergy, and by all God's people that offer their many gifts to point to the reign of God. Growing up I was little bit of a church mouse and it was hard to keep me away.

I graduated from Eastern Michigan University with a Bachelor in Science. I majored in Professional Written Communications and minored in Creative Writing. After I graduated, I was committed to being my father's caregiver who had been diagnosed with cancer at the time. After he died I felt a call to be a caregiver for others. I applied to be a home caregiver for Affinity Private Care, a company based in Commerce Twp, MI. The people I cared for changed my life in many ways. Throughout my life, I had a felt a call to ministry and during this time it was becoming louder. In every home I went into I felt Christ's presence with me. I found myself, without initiating it, hearing my client's faith joys and struggles. I found the healing I was called to be part of was more spiritual than medical.

All of my experiences throughout my life have built a foundation of faith and made me want to be a minister who walks with people on their faith journeys. After considerable prayer and discernment, I entered into candidacy through the ELCA Southeast Michigan Synod. To work towards my Master of Divinity, I studied at Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, Ohio. Since entering candidacy, I have completed two CPE (Clinical Pastoral Education) units. I served as an intern chaplain. At Miravida Living in Oshkosh, WI, I developed my pastoral response to people in various levels of health and stages of life. I have enjoyed voluntarily working with various congregations, and serving as pulpit supply throughout the Southeast Michigan synod. I find great joy in proclaiming the good news, teaching, and walking alongside congregations in their discipleship. I look forward to walking our journey in faith together.

Carol Calling:

Please remember **to keep yourself hydrated** this summer. Make sure you are getting enough liquids – and the right relief from the heat. Here is some expert advice from Consumer Reports ON HEALTH, June 2019:

Make Water Tastier- You might be tempted to reach for soda and sports drinks to help you stay hydrated, but these often contain sugars plus artificial flavors and other ingredients with no health benefits. Fill a large pitcher or large bottle with water and sip on it all day. If plain water is not appealing for you, add a splash of fruit

juice or chop up some strawberries or melon or cucumber to add to the water. And you can drink your water either cold or lukewarm- whichever is better for you.

Dress To Stay Cool – Opt for light-colored clothing that is loose and light-weight to allow air to flow freely around your body.

Choose Fruits and Veggies – We know the benefits of eating our fruits and veggies, but did you know these foods also help keep you hydrated? Watermelon is a great choice, but so are strawberries, lettuce, celery, spinach, tomatoes and cooked squash. They all contain 90% water or more.

Whip Up A Smoothie – If you make your smoothies at home, you can skip the sugars and pack your drink with healthy ingredients- and some of the ingredients listed above which can provide extra water for your system.

Prevent Overheating – If you are uncomfortably warm, get into air-conditioning or take a swim or a cool shower. If you are feeling dizzy, weak or nauseated, get medical help and be sure you call 911 if you or anyone with you have any signs of heat-stroke such as passing out, confusion or agitation or failure to sweat. Protect yourself!!

On the expense side, the children's budget was over because of paying off the balance for Vacation Bible Camp and adult budget was over budget as we paid for the Easter ads. Youth and Family Ministry

Kaitlyn Ziegelmaier - One of our youth will be participating in ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM)



Kaitlyn has been a member of Emmanuel all of her life. She started going to Sunday School at the age of two. At four she attended Emmanuel Day School and loved going to our Growing Together Wednesday night program. Emmanuel was a second home for her and a second family.

This coming year instead of attending her Senior year of college she is taking a year off to be a part of ELCA's Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM). In August she will be leaving to go to Senegal, Africa for a year. In Senegal she will live with a host family. Throughout the year of service, she will grow in faith and self-understanding as she engages in relationships and service with local host communities. Service varies widely from education, health and development projects

Kaitlyn is the first student from Emmanuel who will participate in YAGM. Part of the requirement to attend this mission trip is to raise \$15,000 for the program. This money will help Kaitlyn and others in the program. This year there are four Young Adults coming from the Florida Bahamas Synod. Any gifts you donate to Emmanuel will help support Sarah Henning who will be serving in Mexico; Macy Kennedy will be serving in Australia; Lee Setzer will be serving in Madagascar; and finally Emmanuel's very own Kaitlyn Ziegelmaier will be serving in Senegal.

Mission work is not new to Kaitlyn. She first got involved when Jim Cooper sent a select group of Emmanuel's Youth Group to North Carolina to participate in Youthworks. (Youthworks provides Christ-centered mission trips to teenagers and adult leaders in 45 communities in the U.S. and beyond.) Three years later she went to Birmingham, AL on another Youthworks mission trip with Emmanuel's Youth Group. She has spent the last two summers working for Youthworks in Cairo, IL and Jamaica Queens, NY where she ran a Kids Club for the youth in those communities. In May she will head to her third summer working with Youthworks. This year she will be in Chicago, IL and will be in charge of leading worship for the Youth Groups that participate in the mission work.

On August 4th she will return home for one week to prepare for her year away in Senegal. On August 13th she will go to ELCA's main headquarters in Chicago for training and orientation. From there she will leave on August 21 to go to Senegal with her group of six people.

THE EMMANUEL LOGO

This is the "color meaning" description used in designing the Emmanuel logo. It was based on Biblical color meaning research, and included are other symbolic references.

Symbols:

- Circles- Infinity, God, Perfection, Never-ending Seven Circles.
- 7 days of creation.
- Used 735 times (54 times in the book of Revelation alone), the number 7 is the foundation of God's word. If we include with this count how many times 'sevenfold' (6) and 'seventh' (119) is used, our total jumps to 860 references.

Seven is the number of completeness and perfection (both physical and spiritual). It derives much of its meaning from being tied directly to God's creation of all things. According to some Jewish traditions, the creation of Adam occurred on September 26, 3760 B.C. (or the first day of Tishri, which is the seventh month on the Hebrew calendar). The word 'created' is used 7 times describing God's creative work (Genesis 1:1, 21, 27 three times; 2:3; 2:4). There are 7 days in a week and God's Sabbath is on the 7th day.

The Bible, as a whole, was originally divided into 7 major divisions. They are 1) the Law; 2) the Prophets; 3) the Writings, or Psalms; 4) the Gospels and Acts; 5) the General Epistles; 6) the Epistles of Paul; and 7) the book of Revelation.
