Who is Your Neighbor?

In the Gospel of Luke, we hear a really important question. In the Gospel of Luke, a man asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29). We hear it often that we should love our neighbors but sometimes we don't examine who our neighbor is today. Take a moment for yourself and reflect on the question the man asked.



Who is your neighbor? What does the person look like? Do they look similar to you? Does your neighbor have the same faith background as you? Do they have financial means? What is their occupation? Are they easy to love or difficult? In hearing Jesus' parable, we may be challenged in our definition of neighbor.

In Jesus' parable, the person who shows neighborly love is a foreigner, not Jewish, and not someone that Jesus' followers would expect to be living out the faith. The idea that Samaritan could be "good" and "neighborly" is impossible for the disciples. Imagine someone who you wouldn't consider your neighbor, someone who you fear, or who you don't expect to live out your faith. Imagine Jesus just told you a story that said this same person is the one who is a true example of showing love for neighbor. Jesus often challenges us to see the gift and value in every person.

The word "neighbor" to Jesus doesn't have boundaries that we often try to set. Who are we called to show neighborly love to? Who is our neighbor? Our neighbor is anyone in need.
