

The what & the why?

Dinners for 6, or 8 (or 7, 9, 10) is an opportunity to gather with a group of adults from Emmanuel and share a meal while getting to know one another. Our goal, is that this same group would meet for dinner one time in January, one time in February, one time in March and one time in April. Often, we can only meet in fellowship on Sundays. Dinners for 6, or 8 is a program offering a break to this cycle by intentionally placing members together, who do not know each other well, in fellowship over a meal, centered on a brief prayer, scripture, and blessing. Getting to know our sisters and brothers in Christ at Emmanuel is essential for us in our growth in faith together. 2019 was our kickoff year and we had more than 20 dinner groups participating. This season we hope to have even more people involved. One of our new goals this year is to invite individuals and preexisting groups to look for "creative ways" to grow and expand their experience. This could mean inviting new people into your group, or becoming a facilitator, or maybe joining another group. The main thing is that you are involved. Please pray about it and let the Holy Spirit be your guide.

What's involved?

Dinners for 6, or 8 will begin in January. So the only thing to do now is to sign up. If you're up north until January, no problem, just sign up by going to the church's website, or by calling, or sending an email. On Friday, January 3, everyone who signed up will receive an email telling them who is in their group. In the email, you will be given the simple instructions to organize a group email and make a few simple decisions as a group. **Decision #1:** What date will the group have its first dinner together in January? **Decision #2:** Who from the group will host the dinner in January? **Decision #3:** What's for dinner? **Decision #4:** What should each person\couple bring for the first dinner? **Decision #5:** Who will be the "group facilitator" for the first dinner? After that, get ready for a wonderful evening together!

This means that during our 19 years of partnership with Habitat we have paid for the materials to provide safe, decent housing for over 150 less fortunate people in our community! This milestone is a record among all of the congregations of all denominations here in Collier County.



But our work is far from complete. Over 17 families have applied for each of the 90 houses that Habitat plans to build in 2019!



The Emmanuel Choir is now "in full swing"-- and is always looking for new members who love to sing. On Sundays the Choir usually sings at the 9:30 worship service.



Carol Calling:

Welcome 2020!!

I pray you all had a safe and blessed holiday season. In order to continue living our Blue Zone Power 9 principles, we need to again consider number 1- Move Naturally and number 2- Have Purpose. Then we can now consider number 3 – DOWN SHIFT ...The goal is to reverse disease by finding a stress-relieving strategy that works for you. Think about meditation or music or reading or just quiet time for yourself – whatever it is that

works for you, be mindful of it and make it work.

This month, I want to give you 6 easy ways to prevent falls in your home. We are careful to have our smoke detectors tested and our wiring updated, but are you mindful of the little things in your home that can make it safer and protect you from falling? Here are some suggestions:

- 1. Upgrade your bathroom grab bars around tubs and toilets are a must. You will need them to be professionally installed to make sure they are at the right level and are fastened securely to the walls. Place a nonslip rubber mat in your shower or tub and make sure any bath mat you use has nonskid backing.
- 2. Light up have overhead lights at the top and bottom of staircases, and lights around all exterior entryways. Ask for help when using a ladder, and place motion activated night lights along routes you may travel at night.
- 3. Clean floors carefully-you can make tile floors and other floors less of a hazard by replacing commercial cleaners with a homemade solution of 1 cup of distilled white vinegar mixed into 3-4 gallons of warm water. This solution will clean your floors but won't leave a slippery film.
- 4. Secure your furniture furniture, TV and appliance "tip-over injuries" harm 29,000 people every year. Anchor ward-robes, dressers, bookcases and TVs with furniture restraints or anchoring kits.
- 5. Get rid of trip hazards pet toys, electrical cords and shoes should not be left in frequently traveled areas of your home. Be sure to clear hallways, stairs and specially the route you take in the middle of the night to the bathroom. Either ditch area rugs or choose those with rubber bottoms. Uneven flooring between rooms can be trip hazards. Installing transition strips (threshold covers) can help smooth out the floor a little and create a safer pathway.
- 6. Sturdy up your stairs if your staircases have only one rail, add a second one of the other side. This gives you an extra place to grip. Add colored tape to the edges of each individual step to help you see them better. Fix outdoor steps that are cracked or wobbly, and add a railing if there are more than two steps.



Remember that January is Cervical Cancer Awareness Month.


