New Vision: Micro-Lending Retreat





On Saturday, April 22, Emmanuel had its first ever all day 1K Micro-Lending Retreat. This retreat is part of Emmanuel's emphasis on "Making Disciples for the Life of the World!" Twenty-five of us spent the day learning about the 1K Church Initiative.

The nationally recognized "1K Church Initiative" was launched in 2012 with its main goals of motivating local churches across the United States to use their assets to strengthen local economies. More specifically, the goal is to inspire and equip 1000 congregations around the country to invest in their local communities, building just, faithful, and transformative economic relationships between churches and their communities that reflect what we believe God's economy to be.

The cool thing about this daylong retreat was that it was not just adults, but rather it was 12 adults and 13 energized youth from Emmanuel and Pebblebrooke. This combination of "youthful imagination" and "seasoned wisdom" made the input and discussions much more lively and colorful. By the end of the day we had all grown in our knowledge of the 1K Church Initiative and we were unanimous on our commitment to become one of these churches. We concluded with electing a subcommittee made up of both adults and youth, that will start right away making its first investment into the community into our local community. The journey has just begun!

Now that flu season is coming to a close, let's continue to be careful with careful hand washing and avoidance of others who might be contagious with a cold or head congestion. One bit of advice I want to bring to you is about getting rid of old pills and outdated medications. A medicine cabinet full of expired or unused meds can be risky. Think about giving your medicine cabinet a spring cleaning! Manufacturers are required to stamp an expiration date on medications. This is the date beyond which the manufacturer can no longer guarantee the drug's safety and potency. Most medical experts say you can keep most medications safely

for up to 12 months. There are two exceptions to this rule: tetracycline pills should never be taken after the expiration date. They can become toxic and cause kidney damage. Expired liquid medications such as nitroglycerin, insulin and injectable drugs like epinephrine should be discarded at their expiration date. These drugs lose potency and may not work well at all. Consult your pharmacist for the best way to dispose of expired drugs.

Consumer Reports ON HEALTH May 2018 has some helpful hints and information on getting a better night's sleep. Older adults need just as much sleep as younger adults- generally 7 to 9 hours a night. Insufficient sleep has been linked to increased risk of falls, cognitive decline and even dementia. Here are some "do-it-yourself" strategies to try if you are one of the older adults that has trouble getting enough hours of sleep. 1. Turn off electronics. Do this at least one hour before you go to sleep. That means not reading on your tablets or watching TV close to bedtime. The blue light from electronics suppresses melatonin the hormone that promotes sleep. 2. Eat wisely. Large meals within a couple hours of bedtime can trigger heartburn and indigestion and can interfere with your falling asleep. 3. Set yourself up for sleep. Dim the lights, make sure your bedroom is cool, listen to some soothing music (or turn on a white noise machine). If you find it relaxing to read before bed, pick up a regular book instead of reading on a smartphone or tablet as the light may interfere with sleep. 4. Rethink your daytime nap. It can make it more difficult to doze off at night. If napping does not cause any problem for you that is good, but usually it is good to limit your nap to one hour. 5. Exercise can also help. Research has shown that exercise boosts the effect of sleep hormones like melatonin. They found that people 55 and older who exercised about 4 times a week for even ½ hour had an easier time falling asleep than those who did not exercise.

Do you need on-hand emergency health information with you when you are out and about? A medical alert bracelet is one option, but many national health organizations, such as the American Heart Association and the American Diabetes Association offer free downloadable medical ID wallet cards. Check it out.


