ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC

Depending on which service you attend, you will hear a variety of music today.

At the 9:00 (Traditional) service, you will hear a lovely rendition of the song, "As the Deer," inspired from Psalm 42. Sopranos Jan Gazdic and Sharon Thoemke, both members of the Emmanuel Choir, will be singing this as a duet.

At the 11:00 (Combined) service, you will be hearing from the Alive (contemporary) band and the Emmanuel Community Church musical group.

For both services, Joyce's prelude will be O God, Beyond All Praising, which is based upon the melody THAXTED (the name of a small town in Essex, England). This well-known tune was written by the early 20th-century British composer Gustav Holst (1874-1934). It comes from the middle section of the "Jupiter" movement in Holst's orchestral suite, The Planets. This tune is normally associated in the United Kingdom with a more patriotic text. However, Michael Perry composed the current text in 1982, "in response to a call for alternative words that would be more appropriate for Christian worship." You can read the words to this beautiful melody in your ELW, page 880.


