

However, the hurricane unveiled the true weakness of substandard housing. Many living in those structures escaped only with their lives and the few belongings they were able to take with them. They came back to find their homes ruined. Many of these people, who were already struggling to make ends meet, are still living in mold-ridden, structurally damaged homes because there is no other option they can afford.

## **Parish Nurse - Stephen Ministry**



Carol Calling:

Naturally, we all want to steer clear of food poisoning, but some recent problems might have us wondering what we can do to keep ourselves safer. James E. Rogers, PhD, of Consumer Reports who is director of food safety Research and testing has some timely advice for us:

First and foremost, when you are cooking at home, be sure you practice good kitchen hygiene. Use separate cutting boards for meats and veggies. Be sure meat is cooked to the proper temperature with a meat thermometer. Sanitize all utensils, knives, cutting boards and countertops. Leafy greens are a common source of

food poisoning because bacteria can adhere to leaves and get trapped in crevices. Always be sure to carefully rinse the greens. Of course, cooking greens is a way to be sure bacteria has been killed. For melon, rinse the rind with warm water and scrub with a veggie brush to avoid carrying the bacteria from the outside into the flesh with slicing. Keep prep surfaces and knives clean. Check your eggs at the market to be sure there are no cracked shells which can harbor contamination. Always refrigerate your eggs and wash your hands when handling the eggs. And one more reminder—don't eat raw flour. This includes unbaked bread, cookie or pizza dough and uncooked pancake or waffle batter. This unbaked flour can contain E-coli.

Yes, our skin needs more TLC as we age. Our skin becomes more fragile with age as it becomes more delicate and prone to irritation, dryness and itchiness. Loss of collagen, changes in blood vessels, sun exposure and medications a combine to affect our skin. Keeping our skin healthy is important because it is the barrier between our bodies and all the potential harms of the outside world. How can we help protect that barrier? Forego those long, hot showers and baths that can dry out and irritate the skin. Toss our your harsh scrubs and just use a soft washcloth to rub over your wet skin. Look for a gentle bar soap or liquid which is fragrance free so as not to irritate and dry out our skin. After bathing, put moisturizer on over damp skin. This helps lock in the moisture. Creams are richer than lotions, and ointments are best at sealing the barrier and retaining water. Be good to yourself and your aging skin...!!

Let us together as a church make a difference in the world by providing wonderful Christmas gifts to needy children here in the United States and overseas. Beginning on






